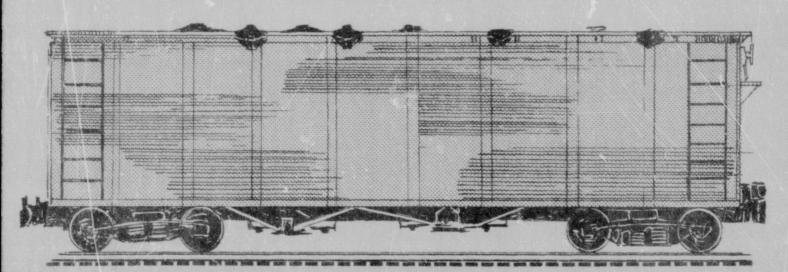

(7) the Any person who shall knowingly and wiffully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be faled, * * * or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a musdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any corner of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a false of not more than five thou and dollars on imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such line and intrastories.

(7) (c). Any carrier or leason, * * * or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an anoual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within theiry days from the rune it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forfer to the United States the sum of one hundred dicitats for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8) As used in this section * * * the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such less, r. * * *.

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

- 2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like should not be used either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries. Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broad classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to t following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or more. For class, Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For class. Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal compa which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, i sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility re income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operatexpenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class SI. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those perform switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class \$2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnial terminal trackage or versional facilities only such as union passenger or freight statistics stockyards, etc., for which is charge is made, whether operated for print account of for rever in case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should included under this heading.

Class 53. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching an terminal service. This class of companies toolades all companies whose operations cover a switching and to read, a service, or defined above.

Class 54. Bridge am, ferry. The class of companies is confined to those whose operation

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but we also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic.
