SURFACE TRANSPORTATION BOARD CHAIRMAN LINDA J. MORGAN DEDICATES BOARDROOM TO FORMER COMMISSIONER J. J. SIMMONS III

Surface Transportation Board (Board) Chairman Linda J. Morgan officially dedicated the Board's eighth-floor boardroom as "The J. J. Simmons III Boardroom" during an all-employee awards ceremony held today at the Board's offices at 1925 K Street, N.W., in Washington, D.C. Chairman Morgan named Suite 800 as the "Simmons Boardroom" in honor of former Commissioner J. J.
